

Make a Difference

The Warming Center for our Five Cities Area

Our member Jeff Metcalfe has volunteered the past few years at the Five Cities Homeless Coalition's winter time Warming Center. When the temperature drops below a certain level and/or when the forecast is rain, the shuttle runs from three pick-ups spots and delivers them to the site, this year at Hillside Church on Newport Ave. Beginning at 5:00 PM Jeff greets and checks them in while others prepare the evening meal still others get the cots prepared. The center averages 25-35 'citizens' (Jeff's term of respect), and each person has a task to help out with that evening or in the morning. Everyone also receives a light breakfast before leaving for the day at 7:00 AM. The funds to run this Warming Center come from the Five Cities Homeless Coalition's area-wide fundraisers, such as Empty Bowls, and Finn's Restaurant donations, plus many more. How does Saint John's help out? Members like Jeff (in the past Emanda M. and Sarah O.) Volunteers can become part of the staff as well, or you can purchase tickets to the September Empty Bowls this Fall.

Dress A Girl and Duds for Dudes

Dress A Girl met on January 12th to start out the new year. As usual we had a great time of sewing, chatting and of course, eating! Besides making dresses, we also focused on putting together dress kits for future sewing. And, we do have some future projects on the horizon. Our next Workshop will be Saturday, Feb. 9th from 10 am - 2 pm. We invite all of you who think they couldn't possibly have anything to offer the Dress A Girl Ministry, to drop by and see whatwe do. If you don't sew, you would be amazed at how much help you could be!

Lastly, I think it is important to share with everyone, the impact Dress A Girl has had this past year. These dresses not only provide the girls with a brand new dress to wear – it may be the only new dress they will ever have - but also, the Dress A Girl label is a deterrent to human traffickers, in that it denotes that the girls are part of a protected group. We are so blessed that God has given us this ministry – each dress that is made is chosen by God for a certain special girl – how canwe not be blessed by that?

Here is a summary of the dresses we distributed in 2018:

March - 30 dresses to Henan, China with the Nellermoes.

July - 200 dresses to Arua Uganda with the Lebens

August - 80 dresses to Myanmar with friends of Janice Goodwin

August - 60 dresses to Santa Maria, CA, Iglesia Luterana Santa Cruz

Sept - 75 dresses to Tijuana with DAG team mate, Nancy Clover, for Homes for Hope/YWAM December - sent 120 dresses to Iglesia Luterana in Santa Maria

That's a total of 565 dresses! The dresses we made were supplemented by dresses sent to us by House of God in Redlands. With those, we were also able to send another 250 dresses to Impact Ministries in Kampala, Uganda, and 30 dresses with the Work & Witness Program to Belize through El Morro Church of the Nazarene.

God is definitely on the move.

Contributions by Text

Saint John's Text Donation Number is (805) 250-4073

To register the first time....Enter text number, (805) 250-4073, Enter amount of donation or type "assist", SEND text.

Follow prompts to register.

(Credit card fees .45 per transaction plus 2.8%)

FAQs

How do members give by text message?

After members register, they will receive instructions on how to send donations by text message. Text donations are sent to a 10-digit number where they are received and processed by Vanco. Your organization is provided with a dedicated 10-digit number.

How will the church know when a text donation is made?

Text donations will appear on Vanco's standard processing reports along with all other transactions.

How do members know when their donations are processed?

Members receive immediate confirmation via text that their donation was received. After a text donation has been processed, it appears on the member's credit card statement.

How quickly are text donations deposited?

Text donations are electronically deposited into the church bank account within 2 to 4 business days for credit and debit card transactions.

Are all contributions set at a fixed dollar amount?

No. The member chooses the amount of the donation.

Are text donations ever charged to a member's mobile phone bill?

No. Donations are processed using the payment method specified in the member's online profile. Phone carriers handle only the text message, never any financial information.

What payment methods are available for giving by text?

Vanco Give+ Text supports donations via credit and debit cards.

Can members set up recurring donations by text?

Yes. Donors can text "Repeat" after they've made a donation to make it recurring. They can also text "Schedule" to set up a recurring donation.

Can members text donations to individual funds?

Yes, a special texting code must be included in the text message to assign the donation to a particular fund. Your church determines the Texting Code (e.g. "Haiti") when setting up the fund with Vanco.
