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


### Pastor's Page

### China Boundless Love Camp

July 16-19, 2019, July 23-26, 2019

We provided English skills that included writing, speaking, and reading. These English skills included learning about animals, colors, sports, listening to skits in English, body parts, and clothing. The games were organized and included sports that are frequently played in America such as soccer, volleyball, tag, running, basketball, hockey, and more. The students learned the skills of these sports and how to play them in a game setting. English games were ones that are frequently played in America such as UNO, spoons, English word puzzles, tag, and a variety of card games. There was also English songs at the beginning and ending of each day. These songs included "head, shoulders, knees, and toes," "Itsy bitsy spider," and "Shake another hand." There was also a variety of skits that leaders put on to help students with English skills as well. The crafts were common ones done in America such as baseball key chain, beading, yarn kite, friendship bracelets, animal face masks, picture frames, and New Years Hats.



### "Transformation of our Country, One Child at a Time" by Pastor Randy

Just getting to nine year old Arua Community Church and its main mission ministry, their six year old Solid Rock Christian School, is a learning lesson in itself! Flying about 580 miles per hour for nearly 10,000 miles at 34,000 ft above sea level, with a choice of at least 60 movies/tv shows to watch, is first world technology at its flashiest. On our 3rd flight we landed on a soaked and spongy dirt runway in a 19 passenger plane. Once off the paved road, the last 1/2 mile to the school campus in our tour guide's bus took what seemed like 15 minutes as we swayed, tilted, and navigated deep ruts in rain washed gullies of dirt pathways. Almost no one owns a car and most walk, so who needs a smooth country road, anyway? Life in northern Uganda country side's thatched huts is all about surviving - no electricity, no running water, no natural/propane gas, no oil lamps that we saw, no horses or tractors to plow little fields; just turning rows of soil by hand with a heavy hoe, hard packed dirt floors, blankets over doorways, sticks to fuel little fires, one pot to cook in, eat standing up or sitting on the ground, washing clothes at the brown watered creek, walking up to one mile carrying 3 gallon jerry cans of potable water - this is third world.

Pastor JP told me only those who make \$50/month or more pay government taxes, so none of these Villagers pay taxes, most don't have paying jobs - they are on their own, pretty much, to scratch out a shortened, tough life cycle that has been unchanged for centuries.

It was to this region that Pastor John Paul and his wife, Rose, answered God's call to begin a Christ-empowered church and Christian school for these villagers. But how to finance a dream that required land, classrooms, teachers, desks, food, and tuition/uniforms for the villages' children? Then along come Drs. Mick and Elaine Lebens some 8 years ago to set up a two week medical clinic - invited by Pastor JP, to serve those sickened and weakened by dysentery, ringworm, skeletal stresses, malnutrition, and more. Each day Patty and I have become more impressed with Mick and Elaine's heart of faith, commitment to do something about it, love for the children, and command of the financial, educational, medical, and spiritual needs. By establishing the Zozu Project in Templeton as a 501c3 non-profit organization, they created the Christian funnel for our far away love to be turned into HOPE, LIFE, AND A NEW FUTURE for these Ugandan Children of God to become our sponsored students. You who are sponsors -your students and families love you!

I got goose bumps when the devoted and impressive Principal David said their goal is the TRANSFORMATION OF THEIR COUNTRY, ONE CHILD AT A TIME! And they are doing it in amazing ways! Long walks to school, early starts at 7AM, long six day school weeks, inspired singing of praise songs to the Lord Jesus Christ, two protein rich meals a day, health clinic care for the students and families - at no charge - all of this is paid for by our Christian donations. Every day at Solid Rock these children's mind and hearts are being transformed.

These young girl students can break the poverty cycle of being married off at age 14 for a bride price and having an average of 6 children in the family hut. These girls and boys will never be the same because of this wholistic life at Solid Rock - minds stretched with knowledge and values, faith filled with grace and truth, bodies built up with medical and nutrition care, and a sacred community created around the Cross of Christ and the Swirling of the Holy Spirit! And boy, does it swirl!

I am grateful that Pastor JP entrusted me with preaching two times, Sunday and Wednesday. I thank you for your prayers because God's Word is always good, powerful, and uniting. While up front, giving this message one phrase at a time, with the translator speaking it in the local language, I felt so strongly the bonds of Christian faith from across continents.

Some other highlights are: going with Richard, the school Social Worker, on eleven home visits and being so gratefully received; singing with these Spirit filled children; helping the students write thank you letters to you, their sponsors; Patty and I sharing this mission trip with our wonderful brother and sister in Christ, Frank and Sandy Lebens: and being blessed to witness the **transformation of Uganda - one student at a time**.


