

Council Highlights

- 1. Brian reported that September 2020 revenue was up nearly \$4,000 from last year, September 2019. We are through the first 9 months of the year (75%). Revenue is at 75.55% of the budget and expenditures are 69.46% of the budget. This is a good trend.
- 2. Our new overnight "Safe Parking" is going very well with 3 of the 4 spots filled and providing safety and comfort for those in need of a safe place to park overnight. Discussed possible software upgrades to enhance the exterior security cameras.
- 3. Council is discussing the possibility of having a fun themed Stewardship Pledge Drive via ZOOM or YouTube in November!
- 4. Saint John's employee handbook update is making progress with hopes of completing the revised edition by December 2020.
