# Kids News

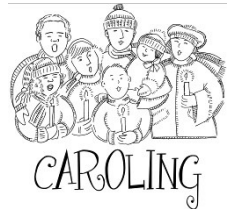

## **What's happening at the ZOZU Project and at Solid Rock Christian School**

Students have been learning at home and are tutored by their hard working teachers who walk or ride their bikes to each student's tiny dirt floored hut on a weekly basis. In spite of these difficult conditions, ALL OF THE STUDENTS TAKING THE UGANDAN NATIONAL EXAM PASSED. This enables them to pass on to the next grade level . We are so proud of these children, the staff and Principal David for their positive attitude and perseverance!!

Social Worker, Richard, organized a career guidance week at the school for the upper grade students. Richard brought in from Kampala a civil engineer, a medical doctor, an accountant, an agriculturalist, a lawyer, and a teacher to show the students possible career options. "Dream, work hard, and you can help your family climb out of poverty", Richard emphasizes. These children are the hope for the future and they are highly motivated through the encouragement of the staff at Solid Rock.

Lots of preliminary planning is being done to work toward the acquisition of additional land and the eventual building of a boarding high school. The staff at Solid Rock Christian School and Pastor JP feel it would be a safer environment for 7th graders to remain in Arua where they can be tracked and supported by the teachers and their families who love them. Child trafficking, early marriages, and teenage pregnancies are potential risks in Kampala. In the long run, it will also be better financially for the Zozu Project to run their own high school as tuition costs in Kampala continue to rise each year. As it stands now, our students move to the big city of Kampala where they are unable to have much communication with their families and 2 visits home per year. Pastor JP goes to visit the school in Kampala twice a month just to check on things. Mick, Elaine, and the Zozu Board are most anxious to make a high school in Arua happen, but will not begin on this huge project until they can once again travel safely to Uganda and walk the land, and look at the needs to determine when construction can begin.

The ZOZU Project which supports the 500 students attending Solid Rock Christian School in Arua, Uganda. As the new school year begins in February and the pre-schoolers come to school for the first time, they need shoes, uniforms, supplies and books, how wonderful it would be to give a donation to meet some of these needs for a Ugandan child and doing so in honor of a loved one. This gift would be recognized on a special certificate for you to present to the person being honored by your gift. What a wonderful way to follow Christ's command to care for the needy.

Iglesia Luterana de Santa Cruz Church in Santa Maria. offers two separate gifting opportunities. (a) The first is the purchase of a certificate honoring a loved one with the proceeds covering costs for food for the many field workers Iglesia Luterana de Santa Cruz serves. Pastor Esteban and his wife, Angie, work so hard to pour love through their ministry by taking sandwiches to the fields and providing lunch after their church service. (b) The second opportunity offered by Iglesia Luterana de Santa Cruz Church is the Angel Tree. You can select a card from the tree containing the name of a child from Iglesia Luterana de Santa Cruz. It will be your responsibility to purchase a gift for the needy child whose name appears on the card. The wrapped gift will be brought to Saint John's by Sunday, December 19th for delivery to the church in Santa Maria.

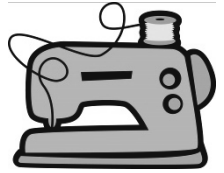
Your participation in Bethlehem Bazaar will both help us serve the needy and direct our focus on the true spirit of Christmas.
