Dress a Girl

About two and a half years ago, Dress a Girl became involved with Points of Light, a group affiliated with the Disney world. Points of Light encourages groups to become involved in their communities by doing projects that are beneficial. Points of Light offered Disney Tickets to the groups involved in the projects, with up to 20 tickets being available. If you think back, Dress a Girl had everyone who came to church one Sunday be involved by writing a prayer card for each girl who would be receiving a dress. We had enough participants that we qualified to receive 20 tickets. The previous year, we donated them to the Youth Group Fundraiser to be auctioned of or raffled, or whatever would be of the most value. It was a great success. So when the next year came around, we thought we would do the same thing. But COVID 19 also came around and everything stopped. We were told by Points of Light that everything was cancelled indefinitely, although they hoped that soon they could offer the program again. Well, finally this year, I received an email that said, they were once more distributing tickets and we would receive the tickets awarded to us in the Springtime. They finally did come, but not soon enough for the Fundraiser this year. However, since we knew they were coming, the Youth Committee decided to go ahead and auction off IOU's. And true to their word, Points of Light sent the tickets a couple of weeks after the fundraiser - I'm sure everyone who had tickets coming have now received them. We do hope that they will be able to reopen this program soon. In the meantime, we continue to sew dresses and send them wherever we can.

Scarf & Hat Knitting

Knitting is still going strong! We have made more than 100 scarves already this year plus quite a few hats. This is a wonderful tine of fellowship with conversations in abundance. It's a terrific social time that allows us to catch up with each other and still accomplish something of value. So if you knit or not, or you think you would like to get back into it, we would love to have you come join us! Even if you don't know how to knit, but may have always wanted to, we will be glad to show you how to get those needles clicking! The pay-off (so to speak) is at the end of the year when the scarves and hats are distributed. We take the time to personally deliver them to some of the homeless camps around the Five Cities area – people are so grateful, it will bring tears to your eyes. Right now, we meet just once a month on the second Wednesday – in July, that will be the 13th, from 9 am to noon.We meet at the Church and the number of people we have decides where we will meet.
