# **Dress A Girl**



Dress a Girl had an amazing year in 2024! God really loves the little children of the world! I say that because in 2024, after giving the bulk of the dresses we collected almost exclusively to Operation Christmas Child, who does an excellent job distributing the dresses where they are needed most. That being said, part of the excitement of being a part of Dress A Girl is finding new-to-us organizations who want to take dresses into the countries they minister in. Of course that also involves getting our sewists and those in the other groups that sew dresses and send them to us, to sew more dresses to answer the demand. In August, I was feeling pretty comfortable with the production we had going on - we had enough dresses to provide OCC with all the dresses they asked for plus another few hundred dresses requested from a group called Life Impact, the leader being a friend of our Simi Valley OCC coordinator....And then as I was packing up those dresses, I received another request from a new ministry, Friends of Hope International, wanting 500 dresses! My first reaction was that there is no way we can make another 500 dresses in such a short period of time! Then, I realized, this was a request from God that needed to be addressed. We had a serious conversation about believing in & trusting the power of Almighty God, particularly when He wants something done. At the end of that conversation, even though I was still worried about how I, me, myself was going to make this happen! God's answer was quick and sure - "You aren't, but I AM!" Was I humbled? You better believe it! By the time we were supposed to have 500 dresses, we had 735! In 2023 we had a total of 1700 dresses - 2024, we had 2065 dresses to give away. God's power is overwhelming! The only caveat is that we must believe in He who is greater than we are, allowing us to walk on water with Jesus, if only we believe.

Dress A Girl meets once a month on the second Saturday from 9 am to 2 pm. If you'd like to experience a "walking on water" experience, come join us - you won't regret it.

# **Council Highlights**

Highlights from Council Meeting January 20, 2025

1. Gordon gave another detailed review of our finances. December giving was far above average, putting us in a more positive position ending 2024 and allowing us to come in much better than budgeted! Trends are very positive.

2. Pastor Greg reported that attendance is also trending up with new families and activities being well attended.

3. Janice reported on the restoration project for the Commons. Currently Saint John's will have a deductible of \$5,000 of the total costs. Project completion will be in February.

4. Nominating Committee has submitted new council member names for congregational approval. Many thanks to outgoing members Louisa and Jeff for their tireless service these past 3 years.

5. Council voted unanimously to provide a business plan for a potential Christian Children's Center to the congregation. A forum will be held prior to a congregational vote, in February.

6. Council voted unanimously to put forward to the congregation for vote a conditional proposal for the rental of land space for use by a cell tower company. Substantial income is possible from this project, if approved.
