

Message from Council President

First, thanks to all of you who have been praying without ceasing for the Christian Children's Center project which you, the congregation, approved in February. Since that time your council has worked hard to put the wheels into motion, and we have been striving to stay on time and under budget. We have seen God's hand through every step!

During March and April I'm sure you noticed the fenced areas around our existing playground and on the east end of the education wing on the grass. These were the first real steps toward fulfilling the requirements for licensing with the State of California.

Another piece to the licensing puzzle is having ALL the required equipment in place. This equipment is expensive and was factored into the project budget at new market prices. Cindi Wallace, Barb Johnson, and Dawn Drysdale have had their ears to the ground in the local preschool world, and they got a line on a preschool that was liquidating all of it's equipment inventory due to the owner's retirement. The girls went on a field trip to have a look and found it all to be in great condition. These amazing ladies brokered a deal to get ALL of this equipment (cots, storage cubbies, toys, etc. - list too long for this article), which brand new would have cost us in the *tens of thousands of dollars*, for \$5000! The owner sold us the entire lot and is allowing us to pay her storage rental fee in SLO until we are ready to move it here. What a blessing!

But, the most critical piece to the childcare facility licensing puzzle is having a Director in place. We cannot even submit an application to the State without having a Director on staff.

We originally drafted a job description over a year ago before the possibility of a Children's Center was only a thought, not a reality. The council prayed, talked, re-thought, and prayed some more, and we updated the job description for the position. Now that it was "reality" we really drilled down into what was critical for the success and the mission - to provide children and their families a safe and nurturing place to meet Jesus. The most important personal quality that we listed on the job description was "A committed, vibrant faith in Christ with a passion to love and serve children and families." We realized we already had someone on our staff who met this personal

requirement and also possessed qualifications above and beyond the job description. After much more discussion and prayer, we decided to interview this candidate first and, based on the results of that interview, decide if we "had our person" or if we needed to look any further.

On May 12, Bob Weiger, Barbara Johnson, and I interviewed Cindi Wallace for about an hour and a half. Based on her stellar résumé we knew that Cindi was qualified, and we anticipated that she would meet our expectations but, at the conclusion of that interview, we all agreed without hesitation that to look any further would be a fool's errand. Cindi exceeded all of our expectations and demonstrated not only her proficiency and desire to lead this Program, but her deep faith in Christ, her genuine love for children, and her fervent desire to provide the families of the children who will come onto our campus with a sense of community, belonging, and support in their parenting journey. On May 19 we presented our findings to the entire council, minus Pastor Greg who recused himself from the process. The council voted unanimously to extend an offer letter to Cindi Wallace. We drafted that letter last week and delivered it to Cindi, and she has accepted our offer! We are pleased to announce that as of Saturday, May 24, 2025, Cindi Wallace is the Director of the Saint John's Christian Children's Center!

Now the hard work begins. We will keep you posted on progress and what you can do to help, but please don't stop praying for this project, for Cindi, for the council, for the children and their families who will come here to meet Jesus, and each person we encounter along the way.

Thanks to all of you for your prayerful support and trust, and for stepping out of the boat with us. God is good, all the time.
