

## Sabbatical Update

### Question: Where will Pastor Greg be on his Sabbatical?

Answer: In July, Lydia & Matthew are getting married. Pastor Greg will be walking his daughter down the aisle and performing the ceremony! He's also planning a silent retreat in the mountains and some visits to churches in southern California. In August, he'll be alone in Colorado Springs for about three weeks working on a preaching book and hiking in the great outdoors. At the end of August, Pastor Greg & Cindi will spend a month in Hawaii (Maui and Kuaui) resting and celebrating 30 years of marriage together.

### Question: What will the Pastor be learning on his Sabbatical?




## **Council Highlights**
