
Knit & Crochet

Council Highlights

Highlights from the June 16th, 2025 Council meeting:

- 1. The Council fully supports the sabbatical for Pastor Greg as a time of rest and reflection. Prior to the beginning of the sabbatical, a memorandum of agreement was signed, as an expression of support for Pastor Greg, and his continued commitment to this congregation for a period of no less than 24 months. Such an agreement between a Pastor and their congregation was found to be recommended while researching details of the sabbatical last year and is considered standard practice.
- 2. As the plans for the Children's Center move forward, the BBQ grill will need to be moved from within the newly fenced area. No decision as of yet as to the new location. Also, a storage container was purchased and placed at the far end of the Los Berros parking lot, to be used for storage. There will be a storage shed purchased to support the Children's Center in the near future.
- 3. While renovation of the Commons Area is important, given both the financial and time commitment required, the Council has decided to postpone further discussions until later in the year.
- 4. The Council will begin work to update the church Employee Handbook.
- 5. Harvest Festival is coming up, mark your calendars for Friday and Saturday, September 26 & 27th! The congregation will be hosting two booths and will be participating in the parade Saturday morning. Mark your calendars, and signups will be posted in August.
